Words of Confession

Confession means we are completely honest with God and others about our flaws and failures. Instead of hiding in shame or self-defensiveness, we admit our sin, and open ourselves to God's mercy available through Christ alone.

Selection from 2 Thessalonians 3:10-15

If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. . . now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. As for you brothers, do not grow weary in doing good.

Ecclesiastes 3:12-13; Colossians 3:23-24

Scripture Reading - Ephesians 6:1-9

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. “Honor your father and mother” (this is the first commandment with a promise), “that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land. Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free. Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

Sermon: Slaves and Masters (Ephesians 6:5-8)

As 21st-century Americans—with the Atlantic slave trade a reprehensible part of our cultural history—the Apostle Paul’s instructions to slaves feels deeply troubling. Why didn’t he denounce slavery and call for it to end? Why did he tell slaves to “obey their earthly masters?” And does this have any relevance for us today?

Paul was writing within the context of Roman slavery, which, although very different from the race-based slavery of the 16th to 19th centuries, was still no more right or morally acceptable. Embedded in Paul’s instructions to slaves, however, is the seed of liberation that would flower and bear fruit centuries later. Beyond that, moreover, there is a radically life-changing truth for us today. Each of us serves something or someone. And only one master—King Jesus—has the power to truly set us free.

In order to fully understand and appreciate this, we must take a three-part journey:

- I. Bridge a cultural gap: Roman slavery
- II. Retrieve the seed
- III. Plant it in our context

Questions for Discussion and Application

1. How would you answer someone who claimed that Paul's instructions to slaves could be used as an argument in support of slavery?
2. What does Paul's call to serve "as if you were serving the Lord" reveal about the value of work, even in unjust circumstances?
3. How did Paul's words challenge slaveholders as much as they instructed slaves?
4. In what ways does this passage subvert the power dynamics inherent in slavery, even if subtly?
5. How can modern believers apply Paul's instructions in contexts where they feel powerless or undervalued?
6. How does this passage help us understand the difference between condoning a system and ministering within it?
7. How does Paul's teaching in this passage point to the ultimate authority and justice of God, rather than human systems?
8. In what ways—whether spiritually or literally—are human beings enslaved today, and how does the good news about Jesus as King shape our response to these types of slavery?

We exist to proclaim the love of Christ in the power of the Spirit for the glory of God.
