Call to Worship - Psalm 148

As the fountain of all truth, goodness, and beauty, God deserves our trust, honor, and adoration. The call to worship invites us to consider whether we are making God the object of our worship, and stirs us to recenter our lives on him alone.

Words of Confession

Confession means we are completely honest with God and others about our flaws and failures. Instead of hiding in shame or self-defensiveness, we admit our sin, and open ourselves to God's mercy available through Christ alone.

The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper proclaims the good news of Jesus in a way that engages our senses. It reminds us that just as our bodies need food and drink to live, our souls need Christ and his saving work for eternal life. The bread and the cup do not contain power or grace in themselves; rather, the power and grace are found in Christ, who is spiritually present with us as we partake by faith. Instituted by Jesus, the Lord's Supper is a means of grace that invigorates our faith, calls us to remember his once-for-all sacrifice, and anticipates the future feast we will enjoy with him when he returns.

1 Corinthians 11:23-29

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself.

Scripture Reading

Ephesians 5:8-21

8 For at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light 9 (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), 10 and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. 11 Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. 12 For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. 13 But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, 14 for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,

“Awake, O sleeper,
and arise from the dead,
and Christ will shine on you.”

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Sermon: The Spirit-Filled Life

Ephesians 5:18

The command, “Be filled with the Spirit” may be the most concise exhortation for living the Christian life. But what does it mean? The importance of this command will be lost on us unless we understand **I.** Who the Holy Spirit is, **II.** What it means for him to fill us, and **III.** How we can be filled with him.

I. Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is God, worthy of worship and adoration with the Father and the Son. He breathes life into what has been ruined by sin, and brings believers to share in the love of the Father and Son (Genesis 1:2; Ezekiel 36:26-27; John 6:63; John 14:16-17, 26; Galatians 4:6; 2 Corinthians 13:14).

II. What does it mean for him to fill us?

When the Holy Spirit fills someone, it means that the Spirit’s words and desires shape every aspect of that person’s life.

III. How can we be filled with him?

- A. Realize that he is within you (Eph. 3:16, 1 Cor. 6:19)
- B. Realize that he is among us (Eph. 2:18, 22; 4:3, 4; Acts 5:3-4)
- C. Stop grieving him (Eph. 4:30)
- D. Know his Word (Eph. 6:17; Colossians 3:16)
- E. Heed his voice (Eph. 1:17; 3:5)
- F. Pray (Eph. 6:18)

Questions for Discussion and Application

For Kids

1. Who is the Holy Spirit, and what does he do in a believer's life?
2. What does it mean to be "filled with the Spirit" in your everyday life—at school or with your friends?
3. What are some things that "grieve" the Holy Spirit? How can we avoid them?
4. How can reading the Bible help us listen to the Holy Spirit better?
5. How does the Holy Spirit help us to pray?

For Adults

1. Who is the Holy Spirit? What are some common wrong ideas people have about the Holy Spirit? What passages in the Bible would you turn to in order to explain who the Holy Spirit is?
2. Why is it important to realize that the Holy Spirit is a person (that is, a being with independent will, emotions, and intelligence) and not just a force or influence?
3. What does it mean to "be filled with the Spirit"?
4. What is one practical step you can take this week to increase your awareness of the Holy Spirit's presence in your life?
5. What are some common ways Christians tend to grieve the Holy Spirit?
6. Why is it important to learn the Word of God in order to be filled with the Spirit?
7. How can you distinguish between a mere hunch or intuition and the voice of the Spirit in your life?
8. In Ephesians, the last mention of the Holy Spirit refers to "praying in the Spirit" (6:18). In view of who the Spirit is and what he does, what does praying have to do with the Spirit? (See Galatians 4:6; Romans 8:26-27.)
9. The Spirit indwells not just individuals but also the church. How should the Spirit's presence among believers affect what you say and do? (See Ephesians 4:3, 30.)

We exist to proclaim the love of Christ in the power of the Spirit for the glory of God.
